## Sustainability:

Continuing provision will be requested for 2017-2018 from the School Sports Partnership. As the population of the school increases, more competitive opportunities for children will be provided ie A and B teams entered into competitions.

Coaching support will continue to develop the skills from 2016-2017 of orienteering, gymnastics and tennis across both Key Stages. The inclusion of new sporting opportunities will also be provided to enable new opportunities for children.

Staff will continue to develop their professional practice by developing the progression of skills for the sports and activities made available through extra-curricular timetabling. There will be enhanced opportunities for children to use these skills through competition.
