<p>A reading book and a Home Reading Record will be sent home every Friday in the homework folder. Please read with your child, discuss the book with them and ensure they complete the written task which relates to the book; this needs to be returned to school by the following Thursday.</p> <p>Your child also has a library book which we would encourage them to read independently for at least 10 minutes each day. These are changed weekly.</p>	<p>Spellings for this term are on the back of this grid and are updated weekly on Spelling Shed - your child's login is inside the cover of their Green reading record book.</p> <p>Each list should be practised and learned each week for a test in class on the following Friday. They must understand the definition of each word.</p> <p>Please encourage your child to keep them safe and learn them every week. They are also available on Seesaw.</p>	<p>Your child has their own individual login for the free Times Tables Rock Stars app. This can be downloaded as an app or accessed through a web browser. The times tables that your child needs to learn are already set for them to practise. Please encourage your child to use Times Tables Rock Stars regularly, e.g. at least 3 times a week. We will complete times tables assessments in class and also monitor their progress using the app.</p>
<u>Topic</u>	<u>Physical</u>	<u>RE</u>
<p>Research a mission into space - you could look at the moon landing, missions sending rovers to Mars or find out about the International Space Station. Present your findings creatively - this could be a video, a poster, a written report or a powerpoint.</p>	<p>Choose a new sport / activity / exercise to have a go at this term. Keep a simple activity diary to track how often and how long you do it for, how you felt about it before you started and how you feel about it at the end. If you can't try something new track one of your existing physical activities.</p>	<p>This term, we are looking at Jesus and some of the parables he taught. Choose a parable and re-write it as if it were happening today. You could get creative and use Powerpoint or another way to display your story.</p>
