



Autumn Term 1 2024 Year 3 Homework Grid

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Reading Books</u></p> <p>Please read daily for 20 minutes with your child. This could be their library book, books from home or their home reader.</p> <p>Home readers will be sent out every Thursday, please ensure they are returned to school the following Thursday to be changed.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Spelling</u></p> <p>Please see the attached Spelling List for this Half Term.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Times Tables</u></p> <p>Please use Times Tables Rockstars to practice your times table knowledge weekly. Children should know 2, 5 and 10x from Year 2 and must learn 3, 4 and 8x by the end of Year 3.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Topic</u></p> <p>Create a map of the surrounding area of where you live. Use google earth or google maps to find a street view of where you live. Include any OS symbols you have learnt during our Geography lessons.</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Create a shadow puppet theatre using your scientific knowledge learnt during Autumn 1.
